Human Anatomy for Nursing Students



Students entering the Master of Nursing Science are expected to have a basic knowledge of human anatomy and physiology when they start their studies. The School of Nursing and Social Work offers an online subject, Human Anatomy for Nursing Students, which can be taken prior to commencement.

This subject introduces nursing students to the structure and function of the human body. It provides the essential basis for understanding the cellular building blocks of the body and the relationships between scientific principles and laws. The subject introduces students to cells, tissues and organs and explores the structure of the body systems.

Estimated Time Commitment (for entire subject)

96 hours over 7 weeks, commencing:

- Monday 3 August, final exam Friday 18 September
- Monday 26 October, final exam Friday 11 December

1. Complete and return the attached form (including payment) to the School of Nursing and Social Work, nominating your preferred course start date. Payment must be received at least four working days before commencement of each course. You will receive confirmation and log in instructions by email.
2. Follow the log in instructions received by email to access the subject via the University's online Learning Management System (LMS) at www.lms.unimelb.edu.au. For the LMS to function correctly, your browser must have certain capabilities. Please refer to the information on the LMS website to ensure your browser has the required capabilities prior to the commencement of the course.
3. Please note that although you may access the LMS prior to the course start date, the subject information will not be available until the given start date.
